The DOM Search Committee is pleased to announce Rev. Tim Shull as candidate to serve as Interim Director of Missions for the Edgefield Baptist Association.


The son of a Baptist pastor, Rev. Shull is a graduate of Charleston Southern University and New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary. He was ordained in 1986 and first served in church staff positions (music and youth) and has been a senior pastor in South Carolina since 1987. He served as a contract consultant for church planting in the South Carolina Baptist Convention and Lexington Baptist Association. He is the founding pastor of River Springs Church in Irmo, which he planted in 2001 and constituted in 2003. Pastor Shull has a heart for missions and disciple-making evangelism.

Rev. Shull and his wife, Gloria, will be attending the Executive Committee Meeting on Monday, September 8. Everyone is invited to attend the fellowship time from 6:30 to 7:00 in order to meet the Shulls prior to the meeting at 7 P.M.

Helping His Harvest

Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest."

Matthew 9:37-38

As smaller churches which, for the most part, are outside the population centers of our counties, how is it possible that we could lead numbers of people to Christ? Beyond our church children, grandchildren, or maybe our close neighbors, who and where are the people we may reach? Many church folks say they don't know any lost people. Remember that Jesus was in touch constantly with lost people in need of help and deliverance.

Has your church actually and literally delivered the gospel in some form to every home and every person on every road, street, and driveway in your community? Sometimes we overlook people we think are too old, too mean, too bad, too hopeless, or too unlike us. "They wouldn't fit in at our church," we say. But how about Jesus's church? Would they be welcome there? Have we forgotten that "our church" is His church? Matthew 16:18.

In truth, the potential for salvation of sinners and numerical growth in your church is all around you. Your job is to go and gather. God supplies the harvest. Could you assemble a team to go and gather the harvest around your church community? Perhaps a SS Class might buy a bag of groceries, or do some baking and take to someone. Love on them and invite them to come to church service with you. Offer to pick them up and take them home if necessary. Maybe a class could give a single mother a gas or grocery gift card and invite her and her kids to worship with you. Give school supplies to a family with kids along with a Bible and show them the plan of salvation. People most often respond to kindness and love demonstrated.

The opportunities are limited only by our unwillingness, fear, lack of vision or training, etc. I would be honored to share with churches or individuals ways to organize for outreach or to share the Gospel. John 4:35
